



HANDI* CAMP POSITION: COUNSELOR

RESPONSIBLE TO: Camp Director

RESPONSIBILITIES:

You are directly responsible for the spiritual, social, physical, and personal needs, 24 hours a day, of one camper with breaks provided of course. Camper assignments will be made by the Camp Director and other full-time Handi*Camp staff members taking into consideration your strengths, preferences and experience. When providing physical and personal care of your camper, you are expected to work as a team in your cabin, thus you can team up with another counselor if you need additional help or if you have extra time, you are expected to offer to help others.

The following information details the four basic areas of responsibility for you as a counselor.

Spiritual

- ① You have the main privilege and responsibility, only through the leading of the Holy Spirit, of establishing where the camper is at spiritually and if needed, presenting the plan of salvation to them as well as encouraging them into a deeper understanding of how God wants the camper to live.

Responsibilities:

- ① To get acquainted with the devotional materials (related to the Bible Exploration time) for the camper prior to camp and to assist the camper morning and night to work and meditate on this materials and to apply it to their lives.
- ① To review the application form and any pertinent info on file that we have on new campers and returning campers record it on his or her Gleaning Information Sheet as a helpful tool during the camp.

Social

Responsibilities:

To participate in every activity of the camp program with your camper and to encourage him/her to participate in all aspects of camp life. To foster a true sense of acceptance between camper/camper, camper/staff

Physical

Responsibilities:

- ① To provide assistance in the daily care of your camper such as toileting, bathing, transferring/lifting (from wheelchair to bed, and vice versa) and pushing the wheelchair, dressing, stretching, hair and teeth care and feeding as needed, etc.;
- ① To ensure the general health, safety, and cleanliness of your camper
- ① To keep track of the clothing, the bedding and other belongings of the camper at his/her arrival and departure (a list will be provided by the parents upon admission at camp).
- ① To report any bedwetting accidents, other accidental soiling, or when campers do run short of clean clothes during camp. Also to advise the Camp Director of any problems with clothing or equipment.

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
